MPVGA VICE CAPTAIN TONY CLARKE'S RULES CORNER



LOCAL RULES

Local rules are established for certain abnormal conditions by the committee at each golf course. As we in the MPVGA play on a number of different courses other than our own home course, it is sensible for us to familiarise ourselves with the local rules applying from both the local rules board and from the back of the scorecard.

The following are some examples of situations in which relief without penalty is only available if a local rule has been adopted by the committee giving free relief, although some players mistakenly believe that such relief is available automatically under the rules:

GARDENS

Relief is restricted to gardens that meet certain criteria and is often compulsory. Example where relief would be allowed are:

- gardens provided with ground cover of wood chips
- cultivated or ornamental garden beds
- all formally edged gardens
- gardens defined by white stakes with green tops

EMBEDDED BALL THROUGH THE GREEN

Rule 25-2 provides relief for a ball embedded in its own pitch mark in any closely mown area ie. at fairway height. Relief is available from all other areas only if a local rule is in effect.



TREES OR SHRUBS REQUIRING PROTECTION

Years ago, many clubs adopted a local rule allowing relief from trees and shrubs under 2 club-lengths in height. However, almost all clubs now adopt the recommended local

rule providing protection from young trees which are staked. So height is no longer a factor.

WHEEL RUTS

The local rule will describe the condition from which relief is available. For example, relief under Rule 25 from "clearly defined wheel ruts made by a mower, tractor or motor vehicle".

IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS

(including sprinkler heads) close to putting green The specimen local rule on page 130 of the rule book provides relief

from intervention on the line of play by immovable obstructions within 2 club-lengths of the putting green.

Paths that are an introduced or artificial surface e.g. woodchips, gravel, cement, aggregate etc.

A free drop to be taken at nearest point of relief no nearer the hole. Theses rules above are common at most courses, but please note that free relief is not available without a local rule from the following:

- solidly embedded stones through the green
- cracks in the ground
- bare earth
- aeration holes
- damage to the course made by non-burrowing animals other than birds or reptiles.

Further, there are occasions when a local rule will deny relief where the rules normally provide free relief. For example, a local rule declaring some or all artificially surfaced roads and paths to be integral parts of the course. So, you must either play the ball as it lies or declare it unplayable in terms of Rule 28."

SLOPE SYSTEM FROM JANUARY 2014

As you are aware the new Golf Link SLOPE System of handicapping commences in January 2014. All courses are rated and each set of tees on a course will be rated differently. This means that your handicap will alter every time you play at a different course

Please check your SLOPE adjusted handicap, known as your 'DAILY HANDICAP', with the organizing delegate, before you commence playing, as this will affect your scoring on some holes.
