MPVGA VICE CAPTAIN TONY CLARKE'S RULES CORNER





- "1. Your club is grounded when the grass beneath it is compressed enough to support the club's weight. If the ball moves after that, it's a one stroke penalty and the ball should be replaced. Rule 18-2b.
- 2. If your ball is sitting up on top of some grass and descends into the blades of grass when you address it, it's a one stroke penalty and the ball should be replaced. Rule 18-2, Decision 18/1.
- 3. If you step on your ball in the rough while searching for it, it's a one stroke penalty. Replace the ball. Rule 18-2.
- 4. To take free relief for a ball embedded in the turf. it has to be still in it's pitch mark and at least partially below ground level. It also has to be on the fairway or in an area of the course where the grass is cut to fairway height or less. Rule 25-2, Decision 25-2/0.5.

- 5. If grass clippings are piled for removal, you may treat the area as ground under repair and take free relief. But that relief does not extend to loose grass clippings or piles not intended for removal. Decision 25/11.
- 6. You can take practice swings in a water hazard that clip the tops of reeds, plants or grass. Note to Rule 13-4.
- 7. You may ground your club before playing from a grass-covered area within a bunker or from a stacked turf face. Definition page 23.
- 8. Don't remove sand or loose turf from the area in which you intend to drop or place your ball. Rule 13-2.
- 9. If any part of your golf ball touches the putting green it is deemed to be on the green and it can be marked and cleaned. Definitions page 32.
- 10. During play of a hole, you cannot test the surface of any putting green by rolling a ball or roughening or scraping the surface. Rule 16 –1d.
- 11. You can pull strands of grass from the ground to check wind direction provided it doesn't improve your lie, line of play or area of intended stance or swina.

MPVGA CAPTAIN'S REPORT IAN PURCHASE

The VGA Country Championships were held at the Devilbend Club on 4-5 May. Unfortunately the numbers were down as a result of Country Districts holding conflicting events and with the PDGA holding a Veteran's Championship on the Monday. Overall, the two days went extremely well, despite rather ordinary weather on the Tuesday. Trevor Bishop and his team worked very hard to provide a hassle-free two days of competition. A special vote of thanks is extended to Gorden Warren (major Sponsor), Chris Lee-Brown and Peter Unkles for their generosity in providing prizes for the various competitions. Titleist, Srixon and Callow donated major prizes for the main events.

The Teams Event notice will be distributed on 30th June. I have booked accommodation at the Stratford Motor In - three twin rooms - a short ride from the Maffra Golf Club.

There are still a few members who still believe that they are 'exempt' from phoning in their inability to attend a particular event. Such an oversight requires members organising the morning shift to make the unnecessary alterations.

Please attend to pitch marks on greens. We may not make them but it doesn't take too much effort to

repair them. Remember the golden rule - repair your own + another one!

I recently came across a rather interesting article on the maintenance of bunkers. Bunkers typically take up two per cent of a golf course property and consume anywhere between 10-25 per cent of allocated man hours of the maintenance staff. One high end Queensland resort course pays out over \$87,000 on bunker maintenance each year. That is a scarey amount of dollars to be expended on one area of the course. This article also raises the question are their too many bunkers on certain courses and could these be converted to the grass variety i.e. closely mown grassy hollows and swales?

At St Andrews in Scotland the Old course has 0.4 hectares of sand, whilst at Melbourne clubs Victoria and Royal Melbourne have 2.4 and 2.0 hectares respectively. Whilst the R & A course has a number of pot bunkers, our sandbelt courses tend to have larger and more shallow varieties. In certain Mornington Peninsula clubs bunker maintenance is a real concern so perhaps conversion to the grass variety would decrease expenditure in this area. Worth considering?































MPVGA Events Results
